

It involves significant responsibility to manage our members who perform the patrol activities, and important decision-making when rescues or other challenges arise. Each Patrol Captain gives our club and the lifesaving movement the credit of their services, which many members of the public and community regularly acknowledge.

Members who have joined this season — Welcome. I wish that your time volunteering for our club gives you much enjoyment. There are many opportunities to be actively involved and I encourage you to consider the variety of different areas where you can further involve yourself in our club and in lifesaving. Board of Administration and Membership Report

As another season on the beach closes, it is time to reflect on the many achievements of the year in all sections of our great club.

Membership for the 2016-2017 season comprised:

Membership numbers increased by 38 from last year. Patrol-active members equal 268, an increase of 8. Transfer applications processed for the season were: Transfers In – 46, and Transfers Out- 66.

FUTURE STRATEGY

In November 2016, the BOM engaged Astute Consulting to facilitate 3 workshops. Members of the Boards of Surf Life Saving and Supporters Club worked together to set their Future Strategy vision for 2017-2021.

An environmental scan of the membership was completed using SurveyMonkey and the confidential responses given to the working group. Together the Boards completed a SWOT analysis of the club's current state and used all information available to develop a one page Strategy that states the Boards Mission, Values and Goals. This Future Strategic Plan was presented to membership in May 2017, and a second presentation to membership is scheduled for the July-September quarter.

The Boards continue to work on the Action Items Matrix that lists specific steps to monitor progress to achieve the plan's objectives.

MEMBER RECOGNITION

What an amazing group of people make up Maroochydore SLSC, all working together to make the club the best it can be. It is always difficult to single out individuals, but it is important that recognition is given to those who achieve at the highest levels.

Life Member, Glynn Topfer, was award an OAM (Medal of the Order of Australia in the General Division) for services to surf lifesaving. At club level Glynn volunteered for many roles; and managed to also fit in volunteering at SLSQ on the BAIT Committee and various Surf Sports Committee roles.

Peter Lucas was granted Life Membership to SLSQ at their AGM, August 2016. Peter served as Director of Surf Life Saving for 10 consecutive years and continues his involvement at State level as well as performing patrols on Maroochydore Beach each season.

Congratulations to Ben Ellwood who was awarded Branch and State 18-25 Young Lifesaver of the Year in August 2016. Ben has worked hard as YDO to build a team of members who help run the monthly Youth Events, and build a strong network of friendships based around lifesaving.

Olympic Game selection is the pinnacle of sporting achievement and club members, Alyce Burnett and Jordon Wood, represented their country at the 2016 Rio Olympic. Congratulations on the success in your chosen sport, and the club is confident we will be watching you both race at Tokyo 2020.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

Maddi Korac and Ollie Hoelscher attended the UQ-SLSQ Leadership Excellence Program in July 2016. 4 days of intense learning, fun-filled and creative team building and great networking opportunities with other like-minded surf life savers. They both give back to the club by sharing the knowledge learned with their peers, helping with YEP events and continuing to be part of the club's lifesaving service delivery.

The YEP program kicked off with 20 or so youth registering and working towards gaining their Bronze, Silver and Gold participation awards. SURF SAFE APPEAL continues to be a fundraising opportunity largely untapped. Total funds raised in October 2016 were \$6379.50. With the limited number of members collecting, it is disappointing how little support is offered particularly as funds raised will assist the Club to meet its financial commitments.

CONSTITUTION

To date, the Constitution Review Committee has finished the Surf Life Saving Club's Constitution ready for comment by membership. It is scheduled to present to members in July-September this year. Rewriting the By-Laws is a large body of work and continues. Some draft By-Laws have been circulated to current Boards for comment and testing, i.e. By-Law 8 Club Awards & Member Recognition. Feedback

from the relevant Boards helps the Constitution Committee refine the content to meet club expectations.

Whilst at times progress can seem slow it cannot be overlooked that most club 'volunteers' work in full-time paid employment away from the club. I am grateful to fellow committee members Glynn Topfer, Paul Thomas and Life Governor Ralph Devlin for their help to finalise this job.

At the lead into season 2016-2017 the Foundation had eleven beneficiaries who received support in the previous season (2015-2016), still active as club members in either Junior Activities(6), Youth(3), or Senior patrolling members/competitors(2).

For varying reasons, three of those beneficiaries from the Junior Activities ranks were unable to continue with the Foundation program, highlighting the difficulties that some of the youth/families involved face in their day to day lifestyles, whilst a further two of our active/patrolling/competition members have moved forward into a self-supporting role, and remained active within the club.

The Foundation is pleased to have provided support for those members at difficult times in their young lives, and to have witnessed them develop as strong club and community members. Thus we commenced season 2016-2017 providing support for six beneficiaries.

Of the three Junior Activities members, one in Under 14's has attained her Surf Rescue Certificate and commenced as a Patrolling Member of the club, whilst the remaining two continue to develop their swimming skills and participated in the Junior Activities program throughout the season.

Of the three Youth Members receiving Foundation support, all are now holders of their Bronze Medallion's and are active patrolling members, and two of that number again this season participated in the Club's Youth Engagement Program Leadership Camp, and other club arranged Y.E.P. activities, building their foundations within the club.

The club's relationship with The Smith Family as the major reliable referral source for new potential beneficiaries remains strong, and the club continues to benefit from that relationship.

To assist the Foundation to continue to self-fund their programs, the Club's Board of Management has agreed to identify our annual mid-year Golf Day (August), as a fundraiser specifically for the Foundation.

It is the Foundation Committees intention to promote and develop this annual event to rival our other annual Golf Day (Miss Surf Girl Golf Day- January) in popularity, and to make it another of the Club's "must attend" community events on the Sunshine Coast.

A big thank you to the Foundation Committee members - Nick Clatworthy, Bernie Duncan, Peter Aiken, Phil Lyons and Jenni Belcher, for your input throughout the season past, as we continue to provide valuable support for the disadvantaged youth of the community, and to perhaps shape their future through their involvement with Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club.

A timely reminder of how the beneficiaries, the club and the community have benefited from the Foundations operations since commencement in 2004 follows:-

- Our first ever beneficiary obtained his Bronze Medallion with the club, and went on to join the Australian Defence Forces, and continued as a patrolling member with Arcadia Bay Surf Club (Magnetic Island). He still visits from time to time to say hello and express his thanks.
- A vision impaired youth advanced to a role of Radio Operator (supported) within the club, to help him on the way to fulfilling his dream of a role within the Media.
- Eleven beneficiaries have progressed to obtaining their Bronze Medallions, and become patrolling members of the club
- One current member is a holder of the Surf Rescue Certificate Award.
- One Bronze Medallion recipient progressed to the role of School Chaplain at a local school, providing valuable support to students.
- One of our young beneficiaries has been a member/recipient of the Most Efficient Patrol Award two seasons in a row, as well as being the recipient of the Most Outstanding Cadet Patrolling Member.

On the competitive side, the Foundation has also provided past support for two State Champions- one also the recipient of the Most Improved Competitor Award, and who also visited our sister club in Japan- Shimoda SLSC as a Maroochydore SLSC club representative, and another who was also an Australian Surf Life Saving Championships Team Gold Medallist.

Foundation benefactor Mal Pratt would no doubt be proud of the efforts/achievements of those above mentioned Foundation beneficiaries whose future he has helped shape, and I know all Foundation beneficiaries are grateful for his past and ongoing support.



General Manager's Report Lindsey Palmer

I am pleased to present an update as the General Manager of Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the year ended 30th April 2017.

The Board of Directors have invested an enormous amount of time and energy on the club's future this year with its strategic plan. Identifying goals and priorities, as well as measuring the club's success against targets, while reflecting a strong commitment to excellence in operational and management areas. Maroochydore SLSC is conscious of the need for a strategic plan that meets the needs of the community and its members. The club is a valued protector and an icon of the shire's coastline, allowing residents and visitors to swim safely at Maroochydore Beach.

At the 2017 Keno and Clubs Queensland Awards for Excellence held in March, the team celebrated a year of hard work and achievements, maintaining accolades in three strong categories. Placing 2nd for both Best Surf Life Saving Supporters Club and Best Gaming Venue (Small), and 3rd for Best Event Facilities and Services. This is no mean feat when looking at the competition across all categories and the high standards venues are now upholding across the industry.

How we use and optimise the technology we have in place to service our members into the future has also been a focus for us this year. Recent upgrades have now been made to the scanners on the front desk to improve the customer experience when signing-in and annual membership renewals are now moving to an online payment gateway, streamlining our membership renewal process and saving thousands of dollars in postage costs. Our members will also be offered more rewards through the member's kiosks when they swipe their membership card on every visit.

Our communication to members is also evolving. A majority of members are now using various communication channels to engage, and we can now personalise our communication to members across these channels. Including monthly supporters club newsletters going out via email, sending text messages when a member has associated with an event, and across our social media channels where activity continues to grow strongly.

For the 2016-17 financial year, I am proud to say Supporter's Club membership numbers have continued to climb and we reached over 15,000 members, up from 11,000 members in the previous year. Our members experience continues to be at the forefront of our business, and raising the funds we need to go back into saving lives on Maroochydore Beach.

I know I speak for all members when I thank the Board of Directors for their vision and support over the year.

Our management team and staff are once again to be commended for their continued commitment and loyalty and I thank them for their hard work.





Board of Surf Lifesaving Report Scott Steele, Director

Having served as Deputy Director for the previous two seasons, this season I embraced the formidable honour of stepping up to Director of Surf Life Saving (DOSLS). In our 101st year of operation, Club Captains and DOSLS who navigated the first 100 years have my absolute respect. It's a tough job and I've learnt a lot in the last 12 months.

There were a number of factors our Life Saving programme to address this season. These included:

- 1. Addressing the negative trend in active patrol members (and patrol groups) in recent years;
- 2. Improving quality of patrol performance;
- 3. Restoring our IRB fleet and depth of qualifications;
- Ensuring all equipment was in keeping with SLSA requirements;
- 5. Managing first aid commitments at Ocean Street Markets, carnivals and other requests;
- 6. Optimising training delivery and qualify additional trainers;
- 7. Attaining adequate uniform inventory to meet patrol needs;
- 8. Making the process of finding substitutes easier when required;
- 9. Working with Surf Sports to optimise patrol compliance (approx. 70% of patrolling members);
- 10. Overseeing the recruitment and implementation of the Life Saving Development Officer position.

This is by no means an exhaustive list but rather a top 10, in terms of our focus as a Board. So how did we go?

- 1. Active patrolling members were comparable or slightly up on last year with around 240 all up. Patrol groups reduced by one (back to 14+ Masters). On this point, we have steadied but are not back to the positive trend we're aiming for.
- 2. Most patrol captains met for four meetings this season to ensure consistency of delivery, including equipment checks, uniform standards and general expectations. With inspection results of 331, 338, 338 and 340, we can be very proud of what our patrols have delivered in the Buhk-Wilkes competition this season, and in the presentation and performance of patrols in general.
- 3. Drew Moles stepped up as IRB Captain this year. Our programme of rotating one IRB and two motors each year was dealt a blow by the Arancia debacle a couple of years back (ie incorrect spec boats). With "Layto", "Tracey-Lee" and "Mr Toppy" being acquired in little more than 12 months, we are one IRB away from having a quality fleet of IRBs, which we will be hoping to achieve before Christmas 2017. IRB qualifications are improving. The key to this will be getting new trainers qualified to lessen the load on the Laytons.
- 4. Michelle Burnett has overseen our equipment compliance this season and we have not missed a single inspection point on account of equipment. Kim Musgrove can also take credit for this result as his grants have helped us to the enviable position we find ourselves in.

- 5. Phil Lyons continues to oversee all first aid initiatives undertaken by the club and manage the First Aid Room. We have continued to provide first aid for Ocean Street Markets and established a new two year contract this season. Ray Johnson has recently taken over responsibility for that initiative and we are now better leveraging the marketing opportunity that this presents.
- 6. Training is a challenge at this point for our club. Member responses to courses promoted have been poor. One bronze and one ATV course have been conducted this year in 2017. We really need members to engage in becoming trainers so that more can be offered.
- 7. We were pro-active in stocking uniforms prior to this season after being unable to supply all patrolling members at times last season. Chelsea and Lauren do a great job managing the uniform cupboard ongoing.
- 8. The "Maroochydore Volunteer Lifesavers" Facebook page has definitely helped make the process of getting subs easier. I can see who's making an effort and the success rate is pretty good overall.
- 9. Both Rob Elford and Nathan Greig have been consistent in their firm support for athletes to commit to patrols. The first half of the season was definitely better than the second on this point so I'll be consulting prior to next season on what we might be able to do to maintain patrol compliance across the whole season
- 10. The recruitment of Ray Johnson to the position of Life Saving Development Officer, has been, in my opinion, the biggest success but also the most controversial issue of the season. As a start-up business in the competitive area of first aid, this business will take time to build but the goal is to make this position cost neutral while recruiting from the community into lifesaving and contributing to volunteer training as required.

Before signing off, I'd like to thank all BOSLS Members and Patrol Captains for their work throughout the 12 month period. Ollie Hoelscher has been a supportive Deputy Director and Patrol Captain for one of the experimental, new "full day" patrols. Ollie is also involved with youth, on the Membership Board and a Duty Officer and Wave Runner for Branch. Drew Moles stepped up as IRB Captain and continued as Patrol Captain, Noel Furmage – Radio Officer and Surfcom, Brad Kildey – Chief Training Officer, Phil Lyons – First Aid Officer, Michelle Burnett – Patrol Gear Steward and Patrol Captain, Geoff McMahon – Clubhouse Officer, Jason Childs – Safety Officer, Ben Ellwood – Ordinary Member, Youth Development Officer (Memberships Board) and Patrol Captain, Clive Herrald - Ordinary Member, Club Chaplain, Trainer (in progress) and Patrol Captain, Mike Dwyer - Club Supervisor and sharing the Life Member responsibilities was Ian Layton and Peter Lucas. The remaining patrol captains are Bruce Morris, Wade Lee, Michael Walpole, Sophie Croucher, Mike Rawlings, Kevin Williams, Nigel Ulrich, Ogilvie Thom and Narelle Souter captained the Masters patrol.

Gear Steward's Report Michelle Burnett





Whilst volunteering for these duties is very much appreciated, I can't impress too greatly the importance of honouring

your commitment as a volunteer. If you fail to attend, it puts other volunteers under unfair pressure should we experience multiple emergencies at once.

I understand unforeseen circumstances can arise that may prevent your attendance but a quick phone call to advise me would be helpful.

I believe the first impressions of an environment indicate the professionalism of an organisation and a First Aid room is no different. I ask all members to tidy up after they have treated a patient, and if the bed is used please change the sheets and pillow cases. Remember, your patient may not be the only one treated on the day.

In closing, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow Board of Surf Life Saving members, for their dedication and support, also a big thanks to our Administration Staff.

I wish you all a safe and happy off-season and I look forward to seeing you on the beach.

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques [AID]

The highs of our centenary year celebrations and "The Best Aussie's Ever" hosted on our own beach meant that the 2016-17 season was always going to have huge shoes to fill.

A short period of sleeping in and lazy afternoons soon saw coaches and athletes pull out their training bags, identify the mould cultures growing on those forgotten energy snacks and head to the pool. The cold mornings and fresh wintery days in early May greeted our pool rescue squads. The move to Caboolture's indoor pool meant training in considerably warmer water than had been encountered at Nambour in past years. Under the watchful eyes of Danny Short and John Baxter the squad has seen increasing popularity and grows in strength and numbers each year.

June saw the squad heading to Branch Pool Rescue at Kawana with podium finishes across all age groups then on to Southport in July for the Qld Championships. Two days of competition placed Maroochydore 1st ahead of big budget clubs Currumbin and Northcliffe.

In August they were back at Southport for three days of national competition, a 70 strong squad attending and again exceeding the results of many larger clubs.

August also saw us staying up late and rising early to cheer on our very own debutante Olympians Alyce Burnett and Jordan Wood. Alyce and Jordan's progression through the rounds kept us all on the edge of our seats, Jordan finished 4th in the K4 1000m, and 3rd in the K2 200m B Final. Alyce finished 8th in the K2 500m final amid a field of accomplished competitors. Their commitment and dedication makes them great role models and wonderful ambassadors for the Black Swan.

October kicked off the surf season with State Endurance in early October closely followed by the Coolangatta Gold. The season then compressed into a blur of carnivals with the club attending rounds of Oceans 38 and Summer of Surf, then onto our own Murphy Builders Carnival, undoubtedly the biggest club carnival on the Queensland calendar. It was great to see so many people come forward to support this event both in competition and behind the scenes. It's often those in the background that make events what they are. A sincere thank you goes to all volunteers who made this event such a success. A big thanks must also go to our sponsors. Who without their support this event would not be possible.

The New Year saw the training schedules shift up a gear in preparation for the business end of the season. Branch and Queensland Surf Rescue championships kicked it all off with a small and dedicated group led by Rookie coach Maddie Korac posting some fantastic results and qualifying for the Australian Titles.

Big seas greeted the Branch Competition at Alexandra Headlands again this year after last year's cancellation.

Competition went ahead amongst smaller numbers than in past years with many great individual and team results. Queensland State Titles followed soon after providing strong competition before the season finale.

We moved into the Australian Titles week with great expectations. Youth and Masters competed in fine but sometimes challenging conditions provided some tight racing across all categories. The start of the Senior Carnival saw a fantastic day of competition, Maroochydore medalling in most events contested, but by 2pm things were about to change. Team Managers were called to a meeting and advised that ex-tropical cyclone Debbie was about to change the rules. All equipment was required to be removed from the beach and tent canopies removed; we were expecting 100km/hr winds and up to 200mm of rain in the next 24hrs. Thursdays forecast rang true and after gathering on the beach that morning all competition was suspended. A small group remained clearing tents and remaining craft to higher ground. Friday saw clear skies and strong winds and a sea of brown while competition remained suspended. Unfortunately later that evening all water events were cancelled due to "Water Quality", a decision that will remain questioned for many years to come. Saturday saw Maroochydore hastily field beach relay teams in most age categories, a first I am sure and a wonderful morale builder for all involved. Sunday saw our March Past teams assemble and carry the Black Swan with pride, our U17's taking home gold after years of dedicated training.

Although the Australian Titles was disappointing for some we did achieve some milestones:

- Most medals awarded in a single day
- Australian U17 March Past Champions for the 1st time
- The Shortest Aussies Ever
- And last but not least we now join a small and elite group of clubs having over 200 capped Australian champions in our midst.

Congratulations to all members of Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club, Athletes, Officials, Water Safety, IRB personnel, Coaches, Support Personnel and Parents in the background. You are part of a wonderful team that achieves great things and it has been a pleasure to represent you all.

As you can see, our age group members well and truly dominated the field this year, which would have made for some very interesting single ski racing had the Aussies continued! In addition to these achievements, we seemed to have stumbled across the secret in "how to turn a swimmer into a ski paddler" with Matthew "The Machine" Palmer stepping into the ski relay team and paddling so well, he might have to take it up full time!!! Reminisce of the "Jake Dale" times!

On another note, the ski squad is increasing in size dramatically with the club retaining a large number of youth from the nipper ranks who are now coming into ski paddling age. This is fantastic but also provides a challenge on resources. Thank you to those who have been patient with ski spaces – it's going to be twice as hard this year with even more youth coming through and we only have a limited number by comparison.

We are working through solutions at the moment but preference will need to be given to competitive and regularly training members. From a coaching perspective for the new paddlers coming through, we identified a need for a beginner's coach to help build enough skills for the youth to confidently join Rhys' squad. Kat Egan stepped in as a Youth Development Ski Coach and did a great job last season.

To assist in this development, I have secured sponsorship for paddling ergos that will be housed at the surf club gym. These are used for technical sessions, currently held on Friday afternoons with the youth and have been well attended. Getting the technique right on solid ground is proving to be a great asset on the water. Beach Section Report Glen Wilson



The "Main Roads" title is often given by commentators at carnivals to cover their confusion of what happens on the sand. So let me offer an insight into what goes into preparation for 'beach events".

Sprints and flags both require the body to move at maximum velocity. Our training goals are Speed, Strength and Agility. Inherent in those values is the danger of serious injury.

Why do we do it? The event is always a challenge that has to be answered in a very short space of time and there is very little room for error. A fraction of a second lost at the start or a foot landing in a hole can make a big difference at the finish line.

Our training sessions are short but intense. Through the season, we train on the "short to long" theory. We try for maximum acceleration over the first 20 meters (vital for flags) and build on stride length for the rest of the race.

Because our training is structured this way we don't follow the usual "periodisation" method. We always warm up with technique and mobility drills then cycle through the other components on a weekly basis. As a rule of thumb our training is at 80% until we are three weeks out from a major competition then we ramp up to 100%. Hopefully that keeps us injury free and fresh for each session.

The Senior Beach Group are all aware of our training program and can take over from me at any time. We collaborate on performance goals and training needs which keeps our team in the top end of the beach competition.





Swim Captain's Report Nikki Chapman

To say that the end of this season was an anticlimax would be an understatement! Fortunately for the swim section, the few individual events that were able to go ahead at the Australian Titles were the 2km Ocean events and the competitors that we had entered certainly did Maroochydore proud. In the Women's Open category it was the American newcomers that dominated the event with Kelsey Cummings placing 2nd and Hallie Petersohn placing a very noteworthy 5th. Hayden Cotter was the sole male Maroochydore competitor and he undoubtedly stamped his authority as a very promising up and coming swimmer. 

2016-2017 Season: 'History' is made (Again!)

Ralph Devlin & Peter Rigby Centenary Historians



One of the unique things about Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club, when you look at its Annual Reports over the years, has been its uncanny ability to 'remake itself' by creating a new bit of history.

In almost every season of our 101 seasons, someone has done something extraordinary, or something extraordinary has happened, to add even more shine to a Surf Club brand which is known and respected throughout Australia and in the life saving world.

Here are just a few pretty amazing milestones that collectively shaped our Surf Club identity and tradition:

2 January 1916 - one day after its foundation, 5 rescues were performed by the first patrol. An excellence Award came from Royal Life Saving HQ in London to mark those rescues.

1916-1919 - 11 Surf Club members volunteered to fight for Australia in World War One. All 11 came home by 1919, though some were wounded.

1925-1930 - Maroochydore was the Royal Life Saving Champion Club of Queensland.

1931 - Maroochydore was the QASA 'Flying Squad' 4x100 yards freestyle relay Champion of Queensland, and led the move from 'Royal' to 'Surf' that year.

1932 - Maroochydore SLSC was the first Champion Surf Club of Queensland.

1939-1945 - World War Two- 46 members enlisted in the Armed Services. 6 died.

December 1950 - Club members performed gallantly in the aftermath of a plane crash on Maroochydore beach which claimed 3 lives.

1959 - John Rigby won the Club's first Gold Medal in Aussies competition. He was our first Olympian, being selected to swim in Rome in 1960.

1965- John Rigby was our first Australian Surf Team representative.

1967 - Maroochydore 'Cygnets' were the first 'Nipper' Club in Queensland.

1974- First motorised rescue craft on Maroochydore Beach.

1976- First 4WD Rescue vehicle on Maroochydore Beach.

1979 - First full time paid Surf Club Administrator in Australia — Bard Claffey.

1980- Our first Aussies.

1982 - Our first women members - Connie Nixon, Julie Randall, Delwyn Winston.

1885- Maroochydore holds first Masters Surf Carnival in Australia.

1987- Australia v NZ Trans-Tasman Surf Test held at Maroochydore.

1990- Maroochydore Queensland Champion Club.

1992- Clint Robinson- Olympic Gold at Barcelona.

1997- Shimoda-Maroochydore Sister-Club Relationship began.

2000- Maroochydore World Champion Club at Sydney, and again in 2002 at Florida

2001- Australian Lifesaver of the Year- Mike Dwyer

2004-100th Aussies Gold Medal, the first was in 1959

Just a few big events in our 101 seasons....so what were a couple of big events this season, a couple of milestones? How about these?

2017- First Aussies March Past Gold- Under 17s

2017 - 200th Aussies Gold Medallist - Kara Wills-Grace, Coach, Under 17 March Past

Maroochydore has competed in our most traditional event of March Past for at least the last 70 years, off and on. We have had some good teams at Queensland level from time to time, never winning a Queensland event but sometimes a 'podium finish'. But our team chalked up another feat never achieved before.

We call that a 'Milestone' for 2016-17!

Board of Finance and Resources Report

Sophie Croucher, Director

On behalf of the President, I wish to present the condensed audited financial statements for the financial year ending April 2017.

The Finance Committee established a budget at the commencement of the financial year with the high level of expenditure in mind. The end result is quite similar to that projected albeit income was down on previous years and I wish to thank all of the Directors and Sectional Captains for their assistance and understanding of the budgeting restrictions throughout the year.

Our accounts as at 30th April, 2017 shows the Club's trading account balance in overdraft of \$56,216. Closing creditors of \$49,912 were carried and debtors outstanding \$2,532. Previously, the Supporters Club represents itself as a \$233,318 non-current debtor.

The Surf Club's total income for the year was \$1,534,500 and resulted in a loss of \$80,407 after depreciation of \$285,576 was factored in.

The sub-lease arrangement that was established under a memorandum of understanding with the Supporters Club resulted in rent of \$600,000 received.

Therefore, donation of \$396,762 from the Supporters Club was received which is down from \$448,707 in 2016.

The financial statements of the Club shows borrowings made up of one Commercial Bill of \$1,085,000 which was

raised for the purchase of the Sixth Avenue Property. This loan is on interest only and variable rate terms.

The second facility, a Business Bank Bill Loan of \$204,179 (at last report \$328,029) was raised for the significant renovation and is on a principal and interest reduction basis.

It should be noted that the profit and loss does not include Capital Expenditure (e.g. equipment). As per standard accounting procedures these are captured on the Balance Sheet. For this reason and to simplify the accounts, the auditor has grouped sectional income and expenditure.

This year, the Club also transitioned to a new auditor – MGI Audit Pty Ltd having put the audit out to tender following the last AGM. Further to this, the Club has also adopted a new accounting package, now operating XERO. This has meant the transfer of historical data across to the new platform and going forward we are looking forward to utilising the system for different reporting.

2016-2017 has been another challenging year with just to name a few - the Centenary Celebrations coming to a conclusion, the appointment of a new role Life Saving Development Officer and ongoing capital works required to maintain the facilities. I would like to thank my fellow Committee Members Andrew Patrick, Victoria Berry and Kirk Jarrott as well as General Manager Lindsey Palmer for their knowledge, guidance and assistance throughout the year.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General Information

The condensed financial statements cover Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club Inc ("the club") as an individual entity. The club is an association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 on 3 August 1983.

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is intended to provide users with an update of the latest annual financial statements of the club, and it is recommended that this annual report is read in conjunction with the full financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2017.

The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this annual report as were applied in the full financial statements.

The financial statements, except the cash flow information, have been prepared on accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest Australian dollar.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on 29 May 2017 by the Board of Management.

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


















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
