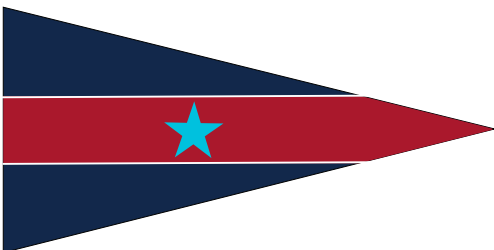

World Champion Club – how good is it to be able to say that again!

Congratulations to everyone involved in the Lifesaving World Championships 2018 campaign (LWC2018) including athletes, management, parents and carers, sponsors and supporters. Thank you to our major sponsor WestFund Health Insurance.

For the record, Maroochydore claimed the overall Youth pointscore by 137 points over Northcliffe with Currumbin in third place. In doing so, we won 9 Gold, 10 Silver and 5 Bronze medals and set three Australian records. With over 90 clubs competing, LWC2018 was the largest youth competition conducted since it was introduced back in 2012.

On their way to winning the overall Youth Title, Maroochydore also claimed the ocean competition with a hard-fought 15 point victory over Northcliffe with Newport in third place and then in the pool to complete the campaign by comprehensively winning the pool competition by 122

also took out the overall pool competition with the men fourth place whilst in the ocean Maroochydore men finished second place and the women in third.

Maroochydore was also represented by a small but very competitive Open Team. Tiarnee Massie and Ally Clarke won a Silver medal in the Open Women's Board Rescue, and a full list of all medallists are provided in the results section. It also marks a return to the World Championship podium for the Club which last won the Open World Championships in 2000 and 2002.

With Club stocks on the rise, we are setting our sights on the 2020 World Championships in Italy where we will defend our Youth World Title and with growth in our Under 19 and Open athletes we will challenge for a podium finish for the Open World Championship.





President's Report

It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the 2018-2019 season. Our members have collectively upheld our strong tradition of serving the community through the provision of lifesaving services.

On Monday the 6th of May we finished our last patrol for the season, after eight months of patrolling our beach. Maroochydore's surf lifesavers officially brought the red and yellow flags down for the 2018/19 season, with no lives lost between the flags. A proud tradition upheld for 103 seasons. An achievement that every Maroochydore Club Member and Supporter should be very proud of.

On behalf of the Club's Management team, I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every Patrol Member for their outstanding efforts over the past eight months. With many challenges along the way, our dedicated team of patrolling members upheld our motto of vigilance and service.

I would like to thank Mal Pratt and Ralph Devlin AM QC for their tireless work across the season providing members with advice and direction in their role as Life Governors.

Also thank you to all other Life Members who have contributed throughout the season, to every Member and Supporter for their work at our surf carnivals, gratitude to our coaches for the time taken to train and mentor our competitors, and a big thank-you to every trainer and assessor who gave their time to upskill and educate our new and existing members.

Our membership is broad and diverse, and everyone plays a key role – from doing patrols on our beach, fundraising, coaching our members, water safety for our nippers, officiating, administration, training and assessing members for competence; and providing operational support during rescues and searches.

Members understand the importance of 'vigilance and service', and how many rescues are avoided through the early intervention and preventative actions of our patrolling members.

Finally, thank you to every member who participated on a Club Committee or Board, your representation of our membership is vital for continued success.

Our highlights of the season started on the 22nd of September

with the first day of patrol starting and the opening of the Robbie Thomasson Room that afternoon, and two weeks later the Matty Barclay Room.

The Senior Room is named after Robbie Thomasson one of our Great Champions from the 1990s. Robbie joined Maroochydore SLSC as a Cadet in 1989-90 season, from Central Queensland.

Coached by his father Cyril, Robbie won the following prestigious Australian Surf Lifesaving Championship Gold Medals;

- 1993 Under 18 Ironman Championship
- 1994 Open Taplin Relay Championship
- 1996 Open Surf Race Championship
- 1996 Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Ironman Series Champion

Robbie tragically died in a car accident only five months later, in August 1996. Robbie will be forever remembered for his Black Swan 'Loyalty, Guts and Glory.

The 'Matthew Barclay Room' is the name of our Youth area, remembering another young Champion of Maroochydore who had been part of our Junior Activities group for many years.

Matty Barclay joined Maroochydore SLSC Nippers in 2009-10 season.

From the beginning Matty impressed as a young lifesaver and athlete of exemplary character.

In 2010 Matty won the under 12 Surf Race at Nippers States.

At the 2011 Aussies, Matty became our then-youngest Aussies medallist earning Bronze in the under 15 Male Surf Teams at the age of 13 years and 5 months.

Matty died in Aussies competition on 28 March aged 14 years and 5 months. Matty is greatly missed and forever young. Matty made his short life wide.

Our competitive team result at the World Titles held in South Australia, where the Club won the under 19 World Championships.

Aussies – placed a credible 4th with a very small team mainly made up with our youth winning 12 Gold medals.

Tiarnee Massie, Adam and Matt Palmer qualified for the Nutri-Grain Series.

The celebrations of the 50th Anniversary of the Nippers and the Club New Olympian Board on the second floor near the steps.

Improved Club Facilities

A number of improvements have been made over the season; including the renovation of the Youth Room and the opening of a Senior Room for the enjoyment and use of these member groups.

Installation of new air conditioners and an improved

extraction system to Male and Female dorms and bathrooms has greatly improved these facilities. Members who stay in the dorms are finding the upgrades a great improvement.

New doors to the beach, new boat and ski rack, new racking for IRB storage.

A bank of member lockers was purchased and installed in the breezeway so members could keep their belongings in a safe & secure place when they were patrolling or enjoying club activities.

A commercial coffee machine was purchased for the canteen, and every Sunday morning JA Volunteers are pumping out coffees to keep our members going.

On the recommendation of the Club Auditors expenditure was set aside to update and expand the security systems and more CCTV's have been installed, as well as an upgrade of the Club's IT server. Replacement of the 15-year old phone system has been made, and the new phone system has a number of automated enhancements.

In May, work is being done to repair the southern awning outside the lady's toilets/dorms where water has damaged the support beams. Also, construction of lunchrooms and offices for the Supporters Club staff has commenced. It is expected to take 2-3 months to complete this work.

Carnivals

As a club we successfully held two Carnivals- Rebel Sports Junior Carnival, and Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic Youth and Open Carnival.

Both events were a great success through the dedication of our tireless workforce.

Shimoda Exchange

Maroochy SLSC and the Shimoda LSC Exchange program has been another great season for both our Clubs with a great cultural experience for all members that are involved. This programme offers so much for our members I hope it continues to run for many years into the future

Anne Dun joined Maroochydore SLSC as a Nipper mum in December 1993.

After a stint as Nipper Deputy Chair in 1996-97 Season, and Nipper Clothing Steward 1997-98, Anne began a long period of involvement in the administrative side of the Senior Club. Anne's involvement continues 20 years later.

Anne gained her First Aid and Resuscitation Awards in 2002 and 2003.

For four seasons between 2002 and 2006 Anne was a regular member of the Club March Past Team, coached by Paul Boulton, between 2002 and 2006, during which time a State Championship Bronze medal was a highlight.

From 2000-2004 Anne was a valued member of the Board of Administration and Membership and Chair of a very active Social Committee. She continued as Chair of the Social Committee for a further two seasons, until 2006.

In the 2004-05 Season Anne was awarded the JFH Murray Memorial Trophy for 'Best Masters Club Person', at a time when Master's activities were at an all-time high. In the following Season Anne was the recipient of the Bronze Certificate commemorating 25 years of Women in Lifesaving.

By the 2005-06 Season it is fair to say that Anne, supported so well by her husband Peter, was an indispensable part of Maroochydore Club life, seen at every Club event, toiling in the engine room and directing traffic. Anne's easy-going yet focused approach to getting the job done won her great respect and admiration.

In the 2006-07 Season, Anne Dun was awarded the Ruth Williamson Memorial Trophy for 'Most Outstanding Female Member', a very worthy recipient.

In 2006-07 and 2007-08 Anne carried out the exacting task of Nipper Club Registrar, before commencing another 7-year stint as a member of the Board of Administration and Membership.

Then from 2010-2015 Anne added a role with the Board of Marketing and Promotion. So her last 5 years in Club administration saw Anne in the somewhat unusual dual roles on two separate Club Boards.

At the end of the 2014-15 Season, Anne had clocked up almost 20 consecutive years of conspicuous involvement and conspicuous service to Maroochydore SLSC.

You might think that to be a fine end to her loyal contribution to our great Club, but Anne remains a willing worker on many of the big occasions; in the 2016 Aussies workforce, for example, and most recently in the canteen for the 2018 State Surf Life Saving Championships.

Anne has also supported the Shimoda Exchange Programme over many years.

Together with her husband Peter, Anne Dun has managed a deep involvement with Maroochydore Club over 22 Seasons, truly exceptional service worthy of her election as the Club's 86th Life Member and our 5th Female Life Member.





Life Member Tracey Layton

Tracey Layton joined the Club on 17 October 1999 and gained her Bronze Medallion on 12 December 1999. She did not 'muck around' - less than two months' training to be a qualified lifesaver proved to be typical of this no-nonsense, 'let's-get-on-with-it' Member.

Little did Tracey know it, but soon she was on a collision course with her soon-to-be husband Ian, whom she met at the Club, and of course, married. Thus began years of involvement of them both in Surf Club life, especially in the IRB section, where both Tracey and Ian have been of enormous Service to our Club and its Members.

In 2002, in only her fourth season of patrolling, Tracey took on the role of Patrol Vice Captain - a role she carried out for 15 consecutive years. If there is a more impressive record of continuous active patrolling service, it would be rare! As if to underline the point, Tracey is only one of three Maroochydore lifesavers to receive the 'Australian Government Record' in recognition of her service of 15 years of in excess of 30 hours Patrol. (For the record, the other recipients are Life Members Narelle Souter and Peter Lucas).

In the 2001-02 and 2013-14 Seasons, Tracey was awarded the Brian Davey Shield for 'Best Senior Clubperson'.

In the 2002-03 and 2003-04 Seasons, Tracey was the recipient of the Ken Neil Trophy for 'Most Outstanding Senior Patrol Person'.

In 2004-05 Season Tracey received the 'Bronze Certificate for Women in Lifesaving 25 years', and followed that up with the highest Club Award - the Ruth Williamson Memorial Trophy for 'Most Outstanding Female Member'.

Between 2002 and 2008 Tracey represented our Club at Branch level as the Sunshine Coast Branch Lifesaving IRB Officer.

In 2009-10 Tracey achieved her 10-year Patrol Award.

But it is in IRB at Club level that Tracey Layton has most indelibly left her mark. As the assistant to husband Ian, Life Member 2015, Tracey has trained many IRB Drivers and Crewies for the Club. Her dedication to the job and her unfailing courtesy and good humour have earned Tracey universal respect.

And it is no wonder that at a mature age Tracey has been sworn in as an Officer in the Queensland Police Service. Shift work has meant that Tracey is not as flexible in the time she can devote to Lifesaving, but her past outstanding service indicates she will be a staunch and loyal Life Member long into the future.

Life Member

Nick Clatworthy



Nicholas Kenneth Clatworthy joined Maroochydore SLSC in 1980. Nick gained his Bronze Medallion at Wanda SLSC in 1964 and was an Active Member at South Maroubra SLSC before transferring to Queensland.

For 28 consecutive years, Nick has been a contributor to active patrolling, every club workforce required, surf boat competition, significant club sponsorship - you name it, Nick was there. Believe it or not, his first major assignment was as a reliable member of the magnificent 1980 Aussies Workforce at Maroochydore. It was as if he had been in our Club forever, even then. And he is one of a select band of loyal members who claimed a place also in the 2016 Aussies Workforce, 36 years later!

A new generation of Club Members perhaps would not appreciate that every year from 1977 to 2000 our Club staged the biggest and best club-run surf carnivals in Australia. For most of those 23 years the carnival - sponsored by East-West Airlines, later Channel 10 and later still Just Jeans - was televised around Australia. Again, Nick was one of a select few who can claim to have been a Senior Member of that Workforce in at least 20 of those wonderful carnivals. Only serious beach erosion at Maroochydore in 2000-2001 brought that series to an end. Nick's contribution was significant to the success of those events.

Nick's wife Gerry was also part of the 1980 Aussies effort. Gerry was one of about half a dozen women who hosted the VIP area for the weekend. Later that same year, women members were finally admitted to Surf Lifesaving. We like to think our glamorous and welcoming VIP Workforce were a major influence on that historic decision. Just putting it out there, acknowledging Gerry's loyal support for our Club in the same period.

In 1981-82 Season Nick was part of the Most Efficient Patrol, winners of the Stratton Memorial Trophy. Nick gained his Instructors Certificate on 10 October 1982. In the same season he was again a member of the Most Efficient Patrol.

In 1983-84 Season Nick was Vice-Captain of the winning Patrol once again, making it an impressive hat-trick of Awards, at a time when our Club was on a significant re-boot from the struggling 70s to the magnificent 90s.

In 1985 Nick was granted Long Service Membership after 21 years of active patrol service across three Surf Clubs. He continued as a proficient lifesaver, however, for many years and often patrolled when called upon.

Nick gained the 25-year SLSA Service Award in the 1997-98 Season.

Another more recent involvement for Nick has been in the Workforce for each Golf Day held by the Club. This consistent involvement demonstrates that as he gets older,

Nick's support is increased instead of decreasing.

Nick and Gerry Clatworthy are long-term Sponsors of Maroochydore SLSC. Their generosity saw them installed as 'Gold' level Sponsors in the 2014-15 Season.

Nick has also served for many years on the Mal Pratt Foundation, where his wise counsel and experience were valued.

Yet another Clatworthy involvement is Nick's regular and sustained commitment to the Shimoda Club Exchange, which happens every Christmas at Maroochydore.

It is difficult to imagine an area of Club life where Nick has not been involved over the past four decades.

Nick and his wife Gerry remain fully engaged in Maroochydore Club Life until their passing early this year. That loyalty and sustained service over almost 30 years sees Nick Clatworthy recommended for election as our 85th Life Member.

In the season the Club's Active 18+ membership has declined by 34 members, but it is encouraging to see the Active Junior membership increase by 26 – a result which assists to hold patrol numbers. In the forthcoming season the Boards of Administration and Membership, Board of Surf Sports and Junior Activities will be actively working on retention initiatives for our youth, and the recruitment of more members.

For another season our members have achieved outstanding results in all levels of involvement of lifesaving. I would like to congratulate all patrolling members who give so much to our Club and provide an essential service to the local community. Congratulations also go to the Surf Sports Section which achieved outstanding results at the Youth Aussie Titles.

Each year the Board of Administration and Management work with the other Boards and interested parties to provide opportunities for our club members (of all ages) to attend personal development events. As has been the norm for the last few years, this year has passed quickly with as many membership development opportunities being offered to our members as possible.

In October Kylie McGrath chaperoned a small group of Maroochydhore Surf Life Savers to attend the 'Parliamentary Friends of Lifesaving' gathering at Government House. The Parliamentary Friends of SLSQ is a bi-partisan group for Members of Parliament to support, promote and actively engage with the Queensland Surf Life Saving Clubs. Club support of this event helps raise our profile with important elected officials.

Later in the month of Oct, the Sunshine Coast PULSE camp was held, and Maroochydhore sent 2 representatives Laura Ioverio and Damon Nixon. Both Laura and Damon found this camp an extra-ordinary opportunity to develop their on-the-beach lifesaving skills. The camp is a great step up for members who are existing Patrol Captains or have aspirations to take on that role in the future.

The annual SLSQ / UQ Leadership Excellence Program was conducted in November and our Youth Development Officer, Jonty Dodson and Laura Ioverio both joined 30 peers for 3 days of intensive development program.

Our youth are a talented bunch and have been recognised at Branch and State camps as committed future leaders and positive role models for camp participants. At the State Leadership Camp, Jonty was awarded a \$2,000 UQ Bursary for displaying Leadership skills amongst his peers at the camp. Camp Commando was Laura Ioverio's first camp as a Leader and her team won the overall Camp Championship. A fantastic result for Laura.

At the start of 2018 Maroochydhore was well represented at Camp Commando where 4 Maroochydhore Leaders / Mentors were selected (Tara Patrick, Sarah McGrath, Laura Ioverio and Claudia Korac); and 9 Participants attended (Stella Kay, Khia Wills-Grace, Amy Short, Kiara Rychvalsky, Selena McGrath, Matilda Jarrott, Mackenzie Hoger, Liam-Bailey Rose, Isabella Stark).

The annual Youth Ball moved to May this season, and Kawana was the host club. I had the pleasure of being the bus driver to the event and enjoyed listening to the vocal range of 12 youth on each trip. Despite my ears bleeding for a couple of days post the event, it was worth it to see how much our youth enjoyed the night. Everyone got in the spirit and dressed to impress. Morgan Williams received recognition as a 'Valuable Youth Member' at the Ball. The night ended with lots of dancing and singing.

Two club members, Ben Colston and Morgan Williams, attended the inaugural Lifesaving Development Program held by Sunshine Coast Branch. This program has been run successfully for many years in South Australia, Victoria and Tasmania and is an experiential learning program where participants can gain 3 awards in 5 days. The program is 'hands-on', as realistic as possible scenarios are offered which can be confronting at times. Below is a report from attendee, Morgan Williams, on her experiences at the camp.

Queensland's first Lifesaving Development Program was held on the 14th-19th of May this year and boy what a week! I went into the program not really knowing what to expect and it pretty much stayed that way throughout the entire camp, as each 'patrol' group anxiously waited for the inevitable scenarios.



The 19 participants were split up into 4 groups which were rostered on to deal with a variety of first aid scenarios; from fin chops to gas explosions, we were all usually caught off-guard. The scenarios we experienced were made to be as realistic as possible, created through fake blood and makeup, actors and props like smashed cars to create a car crash scene and an ambulance coming to aid.

Currimundi Recreational Camp definitely had their hands full with our unusual group, as we marched around the grounds lugging first-aid kits, spinal boards, oxygen and of course our loud and bubbly energy. Through the late nights, less than satisfactory food and intense situations, the group connected in ways I haven't experienced at other camps and lifelong friendships were formed. Having such a small group allowed for us to really get to know one another unlike the larger programs offered throughout the year.

Despite having all the awards offered, it was still extremely beneficial for me, as the camp also worked on building leadership and communication skills needed for day to day life. I would definitely recommend the Development camp to anyone looking to get their First-aid, ART, Crewies or Drivers certificates but also to anyone looking for an amazing week with an amazing group of people.

General Manager's Report

Jack Orr

It is my privilege as General Manager of both Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club and Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters Association to deliver this report in relation to the operational goings-on which have taken place over the past 12 months.

To preface, it must be immediately recognised that trading conditions on the Sunshine Coast are not positive. Given the tourism-based trading trends that dictate business efficacy within the hospitality sector in our region, consistent trading will always prove difficult. Combine this factor with the over-saturation of licenced venues within the area (including some of the region's largest venues being within walking distance) and current economic uncertainty, the problems presented to community clubs such as ours become abundantly clear.

However, despite the complex nature of our trading environment, the Supporters Club has once again proven itself capable by providing the Life Saving Club with funds in excess of \$900,000. This funding has not only empowered our members to fulfil our public service obligations, but has also assisted in the myriad of other programs which make Maroochydore great.

In short, it has been a year rich with success for Maroochydore, from sporting achievements (World Youth Champions, 31 Open Aussie-Title Medals and 2nd Overall at our own Murphy Homes Carnival) to lifesaving excellence (25 rescues and 1796 preventative actions).

In addition to these remarkable achievements obtained by our members, please find below a summarised listing of some of our Club's undertakings from the 2018-2019 season.

- The redevelopment of existing member facilities;
 - The creation of the *Robert 'Robbie' Thomasson Senior Room* and *Matthew 'Matty' Barclay Youth Room*;
 - Redevelopment consisted of creating two spaces for utilization by club members in both official and social settings.
 - This project involved the replacement of all windows, procurement of new furniture, re-sealing of the existing flooring and the implementation of significant design features.
 - The replastering and soft refurbishment of both dormitories as well as senior bathroom facilities.
- The procurement of significant lifesaving equipment throughout the season, so as to ensure the continued high standard of public service offered by Maroochydore Surf Club;
 - A CAN-AM Defenders SSV
 - A Thundercat IRB, named for Life Member Peter Lucas
 - Numerous smaller items including rescue boards, mannequins, IRB motors etc.
- A number of projects have been completed in relation to safety, that being of both Club Members as well as Club assets;
 - The replacement of both beach-side roller doors which had been heavily affected by environmental conditions to the point of becoming potentially hazardous.
 - Both doors have been set for replacement with lightweight-yet-durable aluminium alternatives which will prove durable, user-friendly and secure.
 - The installation of hoist systems to allow for the convenient and economic storage of IRBs.
 - The completion of the CCTV rollout through member facilities, resulting in expanded coverage, longer storage and a higher quality image.
- Looking further at the concept of safety and efficiency, the Supporters Club has completed a major redevelopment of the existing scullery facilities;
 - Previous scullery facilities were inadequate to accommodate for the volume of trade now being undertaken by the Supporters Club catering department.
 - These facilities were not only impractical as a working environment, but also raised potential concerns in relation to safety if they were permitted to further deteriorate.
 - The basis of the project involved the complete disassembly of the existing scullery facility as well as the adjoining offices and the subsequent removal of the dividing wall, doubling the space available for utilization.
 - A secondary pot washer was procured, along with significant bench space, shelving, sink facilities and garbage-control systems.
 - Prior to this project, the western façade of the building would regularly suffer from water damage caused by internal leaking from the scullery facilities. To complete this project, all walls have been sheeted with stainless steel and the floors re-sealed; therefore finally alleviating this problem which had persisted for several years.
- Significant alterations have been made to existing



promotional strategies;

- Ineffective mid-week entertainment has been removed.
- Two weekly poker games and a stylised trivia game have been introduced to the venue's entertainment rotation, specifically targeting what were constant low points in trade.
- The standard members-draw structure has been overhauled to allow for targeted re-enforcement of what would be typically weaker trading periods.
- As is the circumstance with most hospitality venues within Queensland, a large focal point of ensuring financial viability rests upon the maintenance of current gaming facilities.
 - Over the past 12 months, eight new Electronic Gaming Machines (EGMs or Pokies) have been obtained.
 - In addition to EGM replacement, an aggressive game-change policy has been undertaken resulting in no less than 20 game changes taking place over the past twelve months, most of which have come at little-to-no cost as a result of supplier negotiations.
 - Many of these changes have been accompanied by hardware upgrades, resulting in EGMs which would have been designated obsolete receiving a several-year extension on their service life.
 - The existing gaming stools, which had seen many years of service, have been completely replaced over the past twelve months with an aesthetically pleasing alternative, designed to provide patrons with optimal comfort.
 - A number of alterations to the room layout, as well as the additions of stylized screening, have allowed for an increase not only to the areas aesthetic appeal, but also to the level of privacy afforded to patrons.
 - Alterations to the Club's loyalty program has made it more accessible to new patrons, ensuring rewards are fairly distributed as well as encouraging growth to the existing basis of *regular patrons*.
 - A Cash Redemption Terminal (CRT) has been procured, allowing the venue to shift from labour intensive manual payments, to card-based transactions within the gaming room with a projected saving to wages in excess of \$80,000p.a.

The results of the aforementioned advancements can be clearly seen from the results obtained by the Maroochydores Surf Life Saving Supporters Association at the recent Clubs Queensland Awards for Excellence 2019 which draws upon clubs of all forms (Surf Clubs, RSLs, Leagues Clubs etc) across the entire State.

- Best Gaming Venue Queensland – Onsite inspection score of 100%
- Best Dining Queensland – Onsite inspection of 94.93%
- Overall Site Inspection – 96.05%
- Best Young Manager Queensland (Jack Orr) – 4th Overall, with a gap of 1.5points between 4th and 1st position.

In closing, I'd like to take this opportunity to recognise several key contributors, without whom all that has been achieved over the past twelve months would not be possible.

First, to our Executive; the Committee Members, Life Members and Life Governors all of whom invest an inordinate amount of time to ensure Maroochydores Surf Club continues to thrive.

Secondly, the staff of both Maroochydores Surf Club and Maroochydores Surf Life Saving Supporters Association. In the aforementioned Clubs Queensland site inspections, the over-arching positive note listed by the judging panel was the notably high calibre of our staff. The hard work and positive ethos held by these men and women is truly remarkable.

Third, our Sponsors. Without the contributions made by our generous supporters it would not be possible for us to maintain the high standard of public service for which Maroochydores is known.

Finally, our Members; both active and social. The time and effort contributed by our Members, both on the beach and up on level-one, is above all else what allows Maroochydores Surf Club to be what it is today.

In closing, thank-you again to everyone for yet another fantastic year; here's to another great season!





Board of Surf Life Saving Report

Now that the season has finished, we are all no doubt sitting down, breathing a big sigh of relief, and possibly thinking about next season which starts again in September. I wish.

In many ways, this past season has been incredibly challenging but at the same time very rewarding for the achievements we have made.

As you would all know we have trialled two Patrols as all day Patrols (Patrols 2 and 4). Patrol 2 has worked very well but Patrol 4 not so much and will return next season as a normal patrol, meaning it will be more challenging for me in developing the roster.

Speaking of the roster, this season we saw lots of clashes with competitions and patrols. I am determined to sort out a solution in association with surf sports to overcome the issue but be aware that there will need to be patrol changes to accommodate the changes. More on that closer to next season.

At the same time, there has been a small army of people, all volunteers, who have patrolled our beach every weekend and public holiday since September and as a result we can proudly boast that once again we have had no lives lost between the red and yellow flags. Thank you to all Patrolling Members. Without you we would not exist and without the regular patrols we would not be able to compete.

This year we have seen a concentrated effort to upgrade our equipment with things like the new tractor that we now use to take equipment on and off the beach, a new SSV to replace the ageing ATVs we had, a new IRB, several new motors, several new rescue boards with a few more to come, new and additional training rashies, new jackets for patrols to wear when wet and or just cold, new flippers, (which have a tendency to go walkabout) and even things like the folding garage doors that replaced the old roller door. Next season we are being told that our radios will be replaced but until we know the details the current radios will continue in service.

On top of all these things, Noel Furmage our Club Gear Steward has spent copious hours over the season servicing, repairing and replacing gear and equipment. Noel also did patrols as a Radio Officer and has done so for the last five or so years. Noel is moving on after this season and I personally want to say a big thank you to Noel and his family for their contribution over these past years.

Mike Dwyer, our Club CTO for this season has done an extraordinary job in really pushing numbers through on various award courses such as First Aid and ART, as well as numerous other courses. The Skills Maintenance Program went well considering some of the conditions we had to deal with, and only a handful of members needing to do a late proficiency for various reasons. On the IRB front the IRB team headed by Drew Moles, myself, Ian Layton and Danni Driscoll managed to run six IRB courses over the season, three Drivers Courses, and three Crewie Courses. As a result of the additional numbers we now have an IRB Racing Team, something that we have

not had for at least SIX years so once again the emphasis on training, providing additional award courses is beginning to pay dividends. With the new tractor we have put through over 40 Members on the Tractor Induction to assist with movement of equipment on and off the beach. We did restrict Tractor Award to PC, VC, IRBD, IRBC, and selected others to ensure we had patrols and equipment movements all covered. On the last weekend of patrols, we also had a further SSV induction available on Sunday and Monday to give as many members as possible the opportunity to gain that award. My thanks to Drew, Layto, and Danni for their help and support, and particularly Mike for the enormous effort and contribution made.

Phil Lyons has once again contributed as expected to maintain the first aid equipment and patrol as a First Aid Officer. Thanks Phil, (Grandad) for yet another successful season.

Graham Davies once again very capably ran the Radio Officers' position and ensured that each patrol had a radio operator in the tower, trained new recruits and generally maintained the radios that are part of our patrol obligations. Thanks, Graham, for your support and contribution.

I should also recognise all our PCs who have made my task that much easier, with Narelle Souter and Warren (Bluey) Lee as PCs of our Masters Patrols, Bruce Morris, Danni Driscoll, Michael Walpole, Ollie Hoelscher, Sophie Urquhart, Drew Moles, Brad Kildey, Cody Surawski, Kevin Williams, Ben Ellwood, Greg McKenzie, and Graham Thomas all of whom supported the Club and led their patrols throughout the season. Sadly, Michael Walpole and Ben Ellwood will be relocating away from Maroochydore for work, so we are losing them as PCs. Bruce Morris has also decided to go sailing around the world for the next 3 or 4 years so he too will not be returning to patrol next season. Thank you one and all for your contribution and support, needless to say I am looking for people to step up and take on PC roles next season.

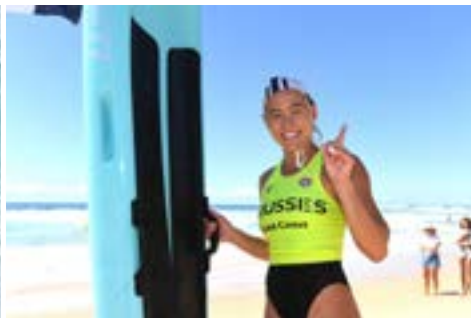

Board of Surf Sports Report

Danny Short, Director

The 2018-19 Season built on the outstanding results of the previous season and positioned our Surf Sports Program as one of the most successful programs in Australia.

But there is still a long way to go.

Maroochydore continues to produce outstanding surf sports athletes through our Nipper Program, and we are now starting to see these athletes move into the Under 19 ranks, and next season into the open ranks. Our Club does produce individual champions but more importantly our Club produces Champion Teams. Great team performances lead to great individual performances and we have seen that time and time again over the course of this season. The success of our program is now starting to attract new members which will build our depth and strengthen some areas of competition where we need to.

Season highlights, where do I start? There were so many across the season, but try these for starters:

- World Youth Lifesaving Champions – overall, ocean and pool!
- Nathan Greig- Surf Life Saving Queensland Coach of the Year award
- Matthew Palmer winning the U19 Coolangatta Gold
- Hayden Cotter – 2 Gold, 2 Silver and 2 Bronze medals at Open Aussies
- Tiarnee Massie – 3 Gold and 1 Silver medals at Open Aussies
- Jamie Perkins – 3 Gold medals at Australian Youth Championships
- U19 Women – Queensland and Australian Board Relay and Ski Relay Champions
- U17 Men Clean Sweep – Individual Australian Gold medallists in Ski and Board (Adam Palmer), Swim (Zachary Tabuai) and Iron (Joseph McMenamin)
- 4th Queensland Surf Lifesaving Championships pointscore
- 4th Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships pointscore with 10 Gold, 7 Silver and 13 Bronze medals
- 2nd Australian Pool Rescue Championships pointscore
- Oceans6 Kellogg's athletes - Tiarnee Massie, Matthew Palmer and Adam Palmer with Maroochydore represented in all 6 rounds of the series

Our results at Aussies were most pleasing – with significantly lower competitive numbers than all the other top 6 Clubs, just a handful of Open athletes and without securing any beach section points we just missed 3rd place overall on the back of the Under 17 and Under 19 juggernaut.

With such a wealth of results we can sometimes miss the importance of seemingly innocuous actions or contributions from our teammates. For instance, Clayton Burnett who prepared for his semi-final of the Under 19 Beach Sprint at

Aussies by spending the morning dragging Matt Palmer out of the water in the heats, semi and final of the Under 19 Rescue Tube Rescue and was duly rewarded with an Aussies Silver medal. Then there was Jett Lancaster who gave up his Individual Board Race start to also help out the Under 19 Rescue Tube Rescue team, again being rewarded with an Aussies Silver medal. These little examples all contribute to a great team culture.

This season the Board of Surf Sports has worked on a range of initiatives aimed at achieving our long term strategic objective of winning the Australian Championships overall pointscore by 2023 and World Open and Youth Champions by 2024. Overall I think the Board has been moderately successful achieving some short term successes such as winning the World Youth Title two years earlier than expected - but we need to do more and more quickly - to mature our existing programs and systems to provide an environment where our surf sports athletes can excel, are recognised and promoted, and are supported throughout their surf sports pathway from Nippers to Opens. If we can do this we will retain our home-grown athletes and attract new members to our Club which ultimately provides an increase in the number of highly capable lifesavers.

One initiative that has produced positive outcomes is the Athlete Advisory Panel that was established at the start of the season. Thank you to Kerri Thomas, Clint Irwin and Alyce Burnett who have assisted a number of athletes across the season. I hope to expand this initiative next season.

This season we have also resurrected the Maroochydore board riding section – aka the Fibreglass Cowboys. This section provides another option for members that seek an alternative competition pathway. Thank you to Jason Bristow and Ian Jobson and we all look forward to seeing this group grow and increase our competitive numbers in competition board riding.

During the season we saw the passing of our much-loved Beach Coach, Glen Wilson. Glen was the gentleman of the beach section over many years, well respected and admired by all that met him but particularly by those he coached and mentored. He will be sorely missed.

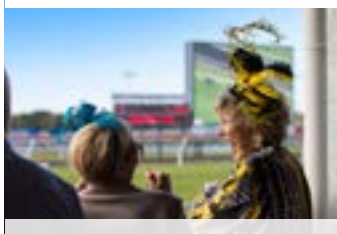

Board of Finance and Resources Report

Andrew Patrick, Director



The members of the Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club, it is with pleasure that I present this report on the financial status of the Club for the financial year ending 30 April 2019.

Again, it has been another challenging year for the Club, and we have all managed to pull together to ensure another successful year competition wise as well as our presence on the beach.

Financially wise, the active side of the Club has also fared well with the main focus of the Board to ensure there have been funds available as required for each section of the active side, whilst maintaining a stable financial base for the Club. We have provided new equipment including the SSV, IRB, Motors, Rescue Boards, Mannequins, etc for use within the Club. We have also provided funds so that athletes can represent the Black Swan at a multitude of carnivals and events across Queensland and Australia.

However, this does not come cheaply, and we have had the continued assistance of making funds available from our Grants Officer Kim Musgrove, to which the whole Club gratefully acknowledges.

Looking at the financials as presented, the overall revenue of the Club has remained fairly stable with a slight increase from the 2018 year, up from \$1,413,735 to \$1,429,681. This has been due to the increase in rent paid from \$444,996 to \$487,909 in line with the sub lease agreement with the Supporters Club. Donations from the Supporters Club reduced from \$503,163 to \$458,386.

However the overall increase in the rent offset the reduction in donations. The remaining funds have been from grants or fundraising by the members.

Expense wise, carnival entry fees continues to be one of the main expenditures for the Club. In 2019 total entry fees for all carnivals amounted to \$68,689, up from \$43,517. We urge all athletes to consider their

representation in carnivals, and if unavailable to compete informing the Team Manager or Coaches. This will save the Club these unnecessary entry fees.

Patrol expenses also significantly increased from \$25,719 to \$34,013 however this does include some smaller assets purchased.

On the balance sheet, the most notable items include the paying out of the bank bill, which reduced from \$83,210 to the closing of the account. With the new funding from BCU, the commercial bill has been transferred from the active side of the Club to the supporters' side, with the loan be renegotiated to principal and interest, ensuring the reduction of this loan. A loan remains between the two sides of the Club, but the actual bank loan now lies with the Supports Club. This has reduced our liabilities from \$1,291,000 in 2018 to \$980,000 in 2019.

Our debtors and creditors also remain within terms with debt carried from prior years being slowly reduced. This has been due to planned repayment schedules across all facets of the Club, ensuring minimal debt being carried where possible.

Overall the revenue loss for the year continues to be enhanced by depreciation and interest. Total loss for the year amounted to \$278,951.

I have been advised by the auditors who have finished their audit of our accounts that we have met all requirements of the ATO. For the year ending April 2019, as stated, we do not have a tax liability with the ATO.

I wish to thank all Board Members, Finance Committee and the General Manager for their continued support and look forward to continued success for the Club going forward.

Grants Officer Report

Annual Reports provide an opportunity to pause, have a break, and reflect on the past performance of a given period and calmly review what has been accomplished compared to previously stated goals, objectives and ideals.

This year we have successfully secured funds through our Grants Program, and a wide range of equipment was purchased which would have otherwise placed quite a strain on the budget and limited resources. The list ranges from patrol whistles costing a few dollars to a fleet of five IRB's and other major and important pieces of essential operational equipment including ATV's and facility upgrades costing many thousands of dollars each.

ATV's, Beach Safety Equipment Fund Approved Items, Beach Signage, Beach Tractor, Café Equipment, Club History Book Seed Funding for Printing, Club History Presentation and Displays at Libraries and Historical Society, Cows for IRB Motors, First Aid Defibrillators,

First Aid Equipment and Supplies, Helmets for Boat Crews, High Quality BBQ's, IRB Motors, IRB's, Lockers, Major Facility Upgrades, Marquees, Miscellaneous items for the Dormitories, New Fridges for Maroochydore Base, Patrol Radios, Patrol Sunglasses, Patrol Whistles, Pro Am Video Recorder, Ski Ergo Training Equipment, SSV's, Surf Rescue Boards both Hard and Soft, Uniform – Shirts, shorts, Hats and Bum Bags and Thongs (approved), Water Rates Discounted Rebate, and Weatherproof Jackets for Patrols.

As my good friend Squizzy would have said" that's not too shabby at all! "

Sure, it's a big job, but ours is a big Club with even bigger dedicated voluntary members, all doing their bit for the good of others, this being the secret to much of our 103 years of Club history and community service.

As Queenslanders all over the State are aware there has been more than a fair share of natural disasters from drought to flood and everything in between and, as such,

the Queensland Government moved to provide help and assistance to those affected by these events. To address the restoration of damaged areas and to provide hope for their survival and recovery, the Eligibility Criteria were changed to direct grant funding towards affected areas, as such, we would never be placed as a Priority 1 and any organisation which received funding above \$15,000 in the past 2 years would automatically be placed as the lowest priority.

After having discussions with the Directors of Surf Lifesaving and Surf Sport there was agreement that our Club has been extraordinary with our successes regarding grants and in fact we have been able to fund ALL of the identified items which were originally presented from our "wish list", with the singular exception of procuring a parachute for the Junior Activities Board. Nonetheless, we have still been successful with the following grants;

Fiona Simpson Member for Maroochydore for the donation of two pop up Marquees at no cost to the Club for use during Patrols and Carnival Events.
